

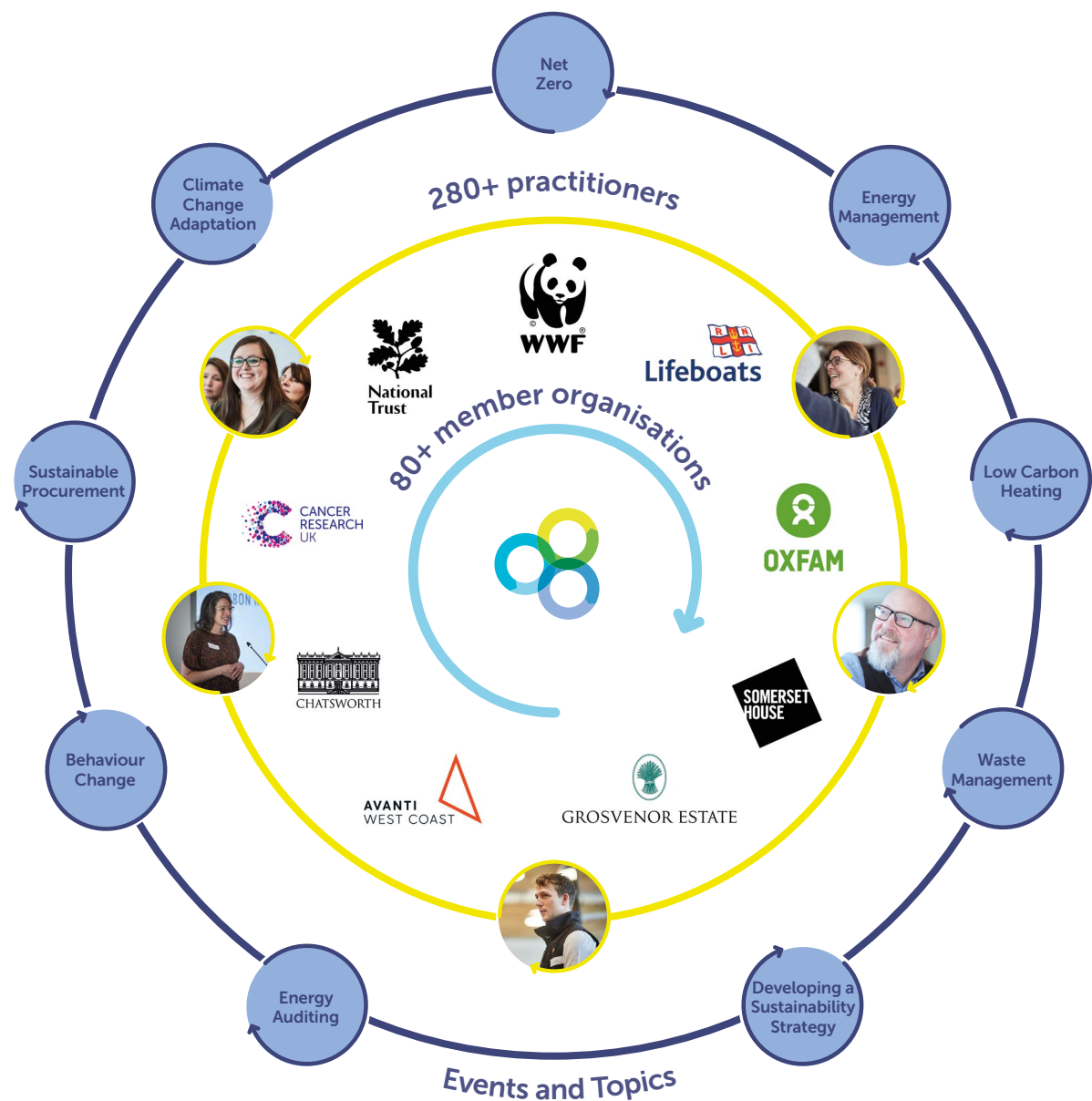


Accelerating Climate Action through Collaboration

How can we help you?

We work with all sectors to support our members to decarbonise their organisations, adapt to climate change and develop business resilience as quickly as possible. Here are just some of the issues we cover:

Charities

- Compliance and environmental reporting such as SECR & ESOS
- Making the business case for sustainability at every organisational level
- Reducing energy bills through energy audit training, shared tips and behaviour change

Heritage and Culture

- Retrofitting and refurbing heritage and listed buildings, including the integration of renewable energy projects
- Understanding and adapting to climate change impacts on buildings and land
- Sustainable land use and management
- Sustainable tourism and transport, including visitor impacts
- Managing sensitive collections and fabric

Public sector

- Practical actions following a declaration of a climate emergency
- Understanding net zero and developing a roadmap to achieve targets

Private sector

- Procurement challenges and value chain management
- Reporting frameworks such as ISO standards, science-based targets, and triple-bottom line approach
- Engaging and influencing tenants, residents and customers



How can you access this support?

Standard membership:

Fit for the Future membership is open to organisations* that align with our vision to work towards decarbonisation, adaptation and business resilience. Membership fees start from £150 for the year and go up to £1500.
